Standard Operating Guideline on

**OUT OF COUNTY REQUESTS FOR
INITIAL ATTACK RESOURCES**

PURPOSE:

The intent of this standard operating guideline is to define the criteria to be used when a request has been received by SRFECC from an adjoining Operational Area for Initial Attack resources.

PROCEDURES:

1. The Sacramento County Operational Area (OA) fire agencies will coordinate all requests for Initial Attack (IA) strike teams supporting incidents outside the OA through SRFECC.
2. The Sacramento OA, when requested by one of the following contiguous Operational Areas, will provide initial attack resources (e.g., strike teams, task forces, etc) to support that OA's incident objectives:
 - a. **Amador County Operational Area** (east to Highway 49, including the communities of Plymouth, Dry Town, Amador City, Lone, Sutter Creek and Jackson)
 - b. **El Dorado County Operational Area** (east to Highway 49, including the communities of El Dorado Hills, Latrobe, Rescue, Cameron Park, Cool, Shingle Springs, and Placerville)
 - c. **Placer County Operational Area** (east to Highway 49, including the communities of Roseville, Rocklin, Lincoln, Granite Bay, Loomis, Newcastle, and Auburn)
 - d. **San Joaquin County Operational Area** (south to Highway 4 / 88, including the communities of Stockton, Thornton, Lodi, and Clements)
 - e. **Solano County Operational Area** (west to Highway 113, including the communities of Dixon and Rio Vista)
 - f. **Sutter County Operational Area** (north to Highway 113, including the communities of Pleasant Grove, Rio Oso, Robbins and Nicolaus)



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- g. **Yolo County Operational Area** (north to Highway 113, including the communities of West Sacramento, Davis and Woodland).
- 3. Requests for Sacramento County OA resources to incidents beyond the parameters established in Procedure # 2 will be routed through California Emergency Management Agency Region IV (Grass Valley) and treated as an "Immediate Need" request.
- 4. The Sacramento Operational Area Coordinator (OAC), subject to the resource needs of the OA, may dispatch up to five (5) IA strike teams or task forces from this OA to support the needs of the adjoining Operational Areas identified in Procedure # 2.
- 5. The *Initial Attack Station Matrix* will be utilized to determine the closest available resources to dispatch to incidents in adjoining OA's.
- 6. A 900 MHZ page notification will be made to the OAC and fire agency representatives whenever an IA strike team or task force is dispatched to, or returning from, an incident within one or more of the adjoining OA's.


