 A single or multiple companies assigned to be prepared for immediate deployment to rescue lost or trapped firefighters.

One Engine, One Truck, One BC, One Rescue Company

03. Procedure:

3.1 RIC Operations

RIC is established at the discretion of the IC. The level of RIC established is driven by the complexity of the incident. The number of RIC teams established is driven by the incident priorities and objectives of the incident. The decision to demobilize RIC is at the discretion of the IC.

3.1.2

RIC Responsibilities:

- Reports to the Incident Commander, Operations Sections Chief or RIC Group Supervisor
- In most cases, RIC will report directly to the IC
- When communicating, RIC will use their company identifier.
- Identify what companies are on scene, what their assignments are, where they are located and brief RIC personnel accordingly
- Determine a staging location and inform the IC
- Develop an appropriate RIC cache
- Conduct a size-up of the structure and soften the structure as necessary
- Do not delay RIC deployment due to over committing resources to soften the structure
- Request additional resources as needed


RIC Group Supervisor Responsibilities:

- If not established, these responsibilities should be handled by a RIC company officer
- May request a separate tactical channel to be used for RIC operations.
- Request additional resources as necessary

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


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
